



Application procedures

- Contact IRO for exchange information (i.e. application)
- Submit the official documents such academic transcript, Certificate of English Language Proficiency (Non-Native Speaker),
- Two photographs (passport size),
- Letter of approval /endorsement from home university,
- Application form of admission (downloaded and sent via IRO email: iroffice@rupp.edu.kh)
- Preferably at least two months before course starts

Admission requirement

International Students

- meet the language requirement set by the Faculty or Program
- IELTS (Overall Band): 6
- TOEFL(iBT): 75 plusTOEF (Paper Based): 550
- GPA: 3.0 or above, and
- English proficiency score record from Home University (Medium of Instruction in English)

IRO Services

- IRO provides the international students with assistance to:
 - provide documents to support Visa application;
 - apply for health insurance (if requested);
 - find accommodation;
 - afford the same academic treatment and access to facilities as regular students;
 - provide any further necessary support or assistance; and
 - help solve any problems which might arise

Length of Exchange Program

The length of student exchange study and program types under the Guidelines are classified into the following categories:

Length of Study

- (a) shorter than three months
- (b) three months to less than six months
- (c) six months or one semester
- (d) one academic year



General Cooperation


- General Objectives of the cooperation are basically to promote:
