SHORT-TERM EXCHANGE PROGRAM & THE KODOKAN EDUCATION PROGRAM

- Short Term Exchange Program in Business and Economics (STEP)
- One Semester to One Year Program requires students to take Japanese language courses and major courses in Business and Economics taught in English.
- Average of 20 students participating each semester. The numbers are expected to double by 2020.
- Students are also required to take a course called STEPPING OUT INTO THE WIDER WORLD (KODOKAN Education Program). This course mixes international exchange students and normal Japanese students in one class to develop intercultural adaptation skills and other important skills needed to engage and be successful in the future. It is used to stimulate the students minds in thinking not only about the cultural differences, but also the critical issues linked to sustainable development.

THE KODOKAN EDUCATION PLATFORM

• Developing the KODOJIN: People of involvement and action with innovative ideas, spirit of challenge, and cooperative ability for joint achievement…

KODOKAN COURSE CURRICULUM

Emphasizing four fields of study:

- 1) Field in Developing Spirit
- (i.e., Power of Laughter; Life Planning; Developing a Healthy Life Using Zen; Love and Manner; etc.,…)
- 2) Field in Developing the Ability to Plan
- (i.e., Learning About Business Analysis and Economics Using a Virtual Stock Company; Developing Planning Skills; Learning About Copyrighting; etc.,…)
- 3) Field in Developing the Ability to take Action
- (i.e., Global Human Resource Development; How to Create NGOs and NPOs; Promoting Volunteer Activities; Business Simulation Games, etc.,…)
- 4) Field in Developing the Ability to Work with Others
- (i.e., Stepping Out Into the Wider World; Presenting Persuasively; Practical Skills in Communication; Learning About Cooperation Through Sports, etc.,…)

MEASURING THE LEARNING OUTCOMES FOR EACH COURSE

• In 2008, HUE was selected by the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Technology for developing a self-evaluation system relating to "Basic Skills for Human Resource Development." Since then, HUE has used this evaluation system in the KODOKAN courses and has required all students to fill out a progress sheet pertaining to three skills and twelve qualities (that are believed to be the basic skills and qualities that are needed to building a sustainable society and that Japanese companies prefer their employees to have) to evaluate themselves on how they have improved in each respect.

SKILLS AND QUALITIES MEASURED

Skill in Moving Things Forward (Making the First Step)

 Qualities: ability to take initiatives; ability to persuade others; ability to execute action


Skill in Thinking Things Through

· Qualities: ability to discover problems; ability to plan; creativity

Skill in Working with Others

 Qualities: ability to present; ability to listen to others and be attentive; flexibility; ability to comprehend the situation; ability to follow the rules and keep order; ability to control stress
